Each night he tells Hjalmar stories – about dancing letters, mouse weddings, and talking furniture.



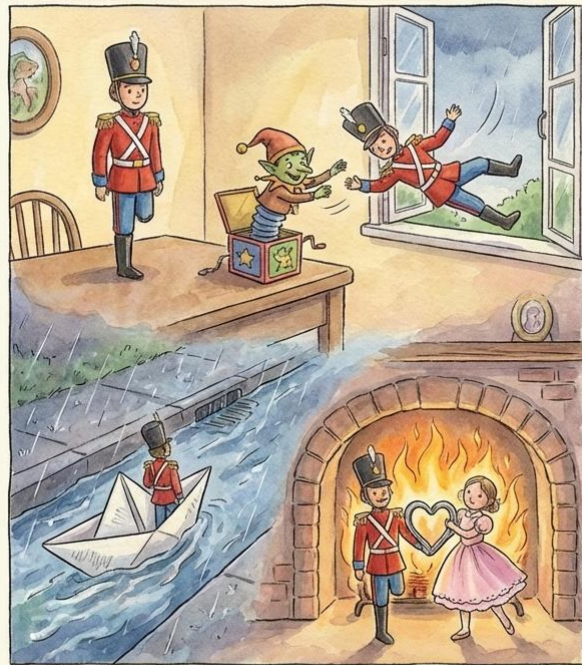


Chapter 4: The Steadfast Tin Soldier

She lights matches for warmth and sees visions of food and grandma.

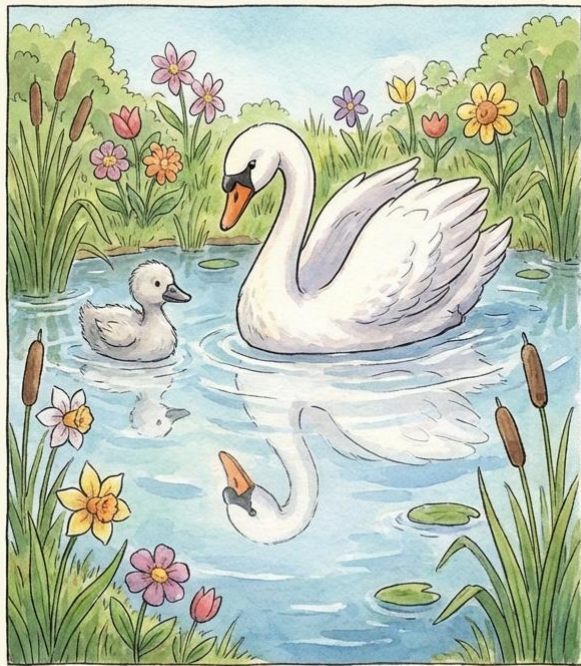
In the morning, she freezes but smiles.





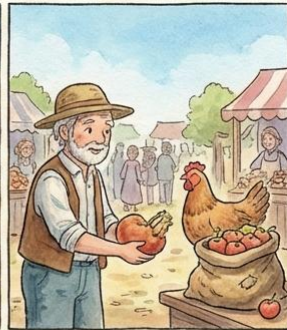
Chapter 7: The Ugly Duckling

Chapter 11: The Little Mermaid

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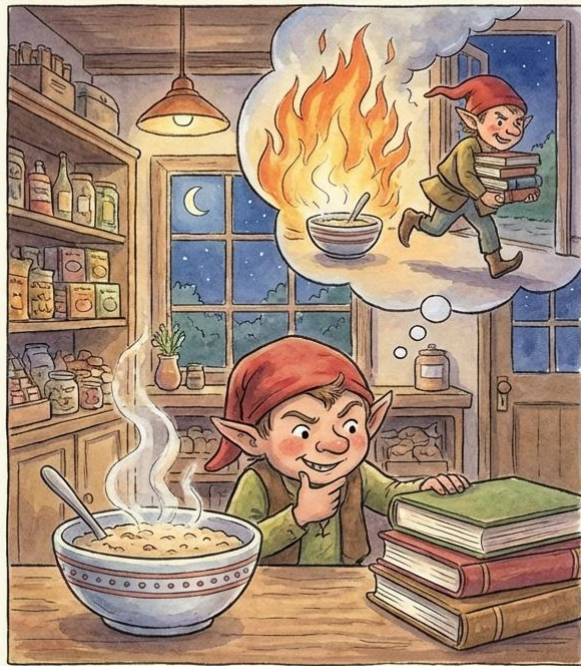
A mermaid saves a prince

but gets a soul.





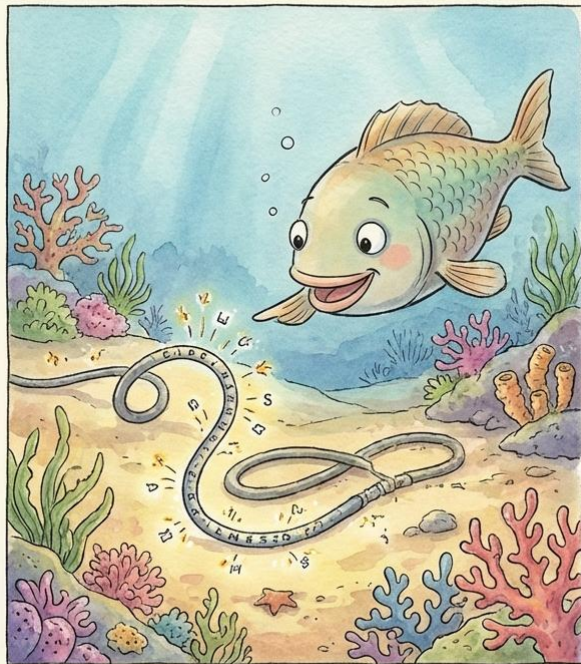
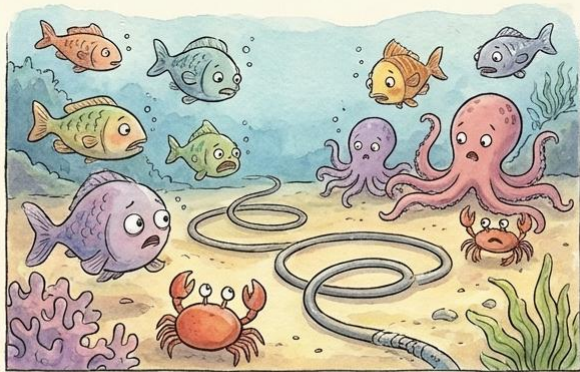
Chapter 12: The Goblin at the Grocer's
